

## Two New Positions with the Data Science team at the Democratic National Committee:

(1) Data Scientist (<http://www.democrats.org/job/data-scientist1>)

The Data Scientist will play a lead role in building and applying predictive models in support of voter outreach, volunteer recruitment, election forecasting, and fundraising programs, and will also take part in polling, experimental research, and analytics/reporting projects. Candidates should have a strong background in quantitative analysis using either Python (preferred) or R, familiarity with relational database systems, and the ability to quickly pick up new skills and manage a wide variety of projects.

(2) Data Analyst (<http://www.democrats.org/job/data-analyst>)

The Data Analyst's primary responsibility will be to maintain and expand a wide range of data sets used by the Data Science team, outside vendors, and major campaigns to create predictive models. Candidates should have experience managing data in relational databases, a familiarity with campaign modeling and analytics, and a desire to learn about all aspects of political data.

These are great opportunities for anyone with methods experience who's looking to get involved in exciting real-world applications of what they've learned, especially heading into the 2016 election.

The team is also looking for interns anytime between now and next fall.
